We have continued to build on our exceptional competition success, winning the District Combined Regatta, and also seeing a number of our cadets winning the Area Combined Regatta. We have thoroughly enjoyed hosting lots of District Competitions and would not be able to do this without the sterling job of our boats officer CPO Mercer and the staff team, alongside the continued support of Tewkesbury Cruising and Sailing Club (with special thanks to Mrs Bailey for continuing to foster this beneficial relationship).

There have been a number of firsts for the unit in recent months. Alone, these commendations would be special for any cadet unit, but together they really do pay testament to the exceptional work that so many of our volunteers do. I really do mean it when I say the 'norm' at Tewkesbury Sea Cadets is well above the 'norm' at most other units.

The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service is the highest national award that is bestowed by Her Majesty the Queen to volunteer groups across the UK and recognises outstanding work done in their respective communities. Since 2002, a few hundred of these awards have been given out. I am incredibly proud to be able to announce that Tewkesbury Sea Cadets have been the recipient of the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service as announced in the London Gazette in June, and this makes us one of three cadet units in the history of the award to receive this commendation. So to say this is a first, really is underestimating the gravity of this accolade! A special thanks to our illustrious Padre for coordinating the award submission and a further special thanks to Cllr Clare Wright who acted as one of the main sponsors. We will be honoured to welcome the Lord Lieutenant of Gloucestershire, Dame Janet Trotter DBE CVO in September to make the presentation and formal invites are in the process of being delivered to make this evening a highly public celebration.

We have also recently been informed that two of our staff have been awarded the Lord-Lieutenant's Certificate of Meritorious Service. This award supplements the National Honours System, and is awarded for service 'above and beyond the normal call of duty'. CPO Paul Mercer, the unit's Boats Officer, has deservingly been awarded this and is a testament to the continued hard work he does not only for our unit,

but for Sea Cadet units across the Corps.

CPO Mercer genuinely puts in enough hours volunteering at Sea Cadets to constitute a full time job! We are extremely grateful for the expertise and commitment he brings to Tewkesbury Sea Cadets. I am also pleased to say I have been awarded the second – and this is even more pleasing because no unit has ever been awarded two of these commendations at the same time before.

Tewkesbury Sea Cadet Unit is to receive the highest award given to volunteer groups across the United Kingdom. The unique and prestigious Queen's Award for Voluntary Service was created by Her Majesty the Queen to mark her Golden Jubilee in 2002, and to recognise outstanding contributions made to local communities by groups of volunteers.

"Everyone who has received this award should be incredibly proud", said the Minister for Civil Society, "their service commitment and care has a profoundly positive impact on communities throughout the country". The Chairman of the Award Independent Committee said, "The recipients of the Queen's Award are at the very top of a formidable volunteering movement in the UK". In a letter to our Commanding Officer, Air Marshal Sir Dusty Miller KBE, Warden of the Honourable Company of Gloucestershire wrote, "I am overjoyed that the extraordinary efforts of your team have been recognised and publicly rewarded in this way. Please pass on my most sincere congratulations and appreciation to all who make the Tewkesbury Sea Cadets the most stunning example of just how good young people can be".

Cadets caught up in airport emergency!

One lovely evening in April, TS Otter Cadets, parents, staff and trustees offered their acting skills at Gloucester Airport's annual Casualty Exercise. The scenario was that a group of cadets and staff were on their way back from a weekend in the Channel Islands when their plane had a mishap and came off the runway. Cadets and staff were all given a role card to act out with some of the casualties on the plane and some of us were strewn out on the runway. Then the emergency crews swung into action with several fire engines arriving to deal with the scene, put out a nearby fire and assess the injuries before the paramedics arrived. CO's uniform led to him being approached many times by different emergency crew asking "are you the pilot?" which kept some of us amused for much of the evening!

The standard of acting from TS Otter ranged from shy to Oscar winning. Padre kept all of the emergency crew on their toes with his 'confusion' and constantly trying to escape the scene whilst PO Campbell Reeves was in role as the distressed Unit Leader right up until the very end! CO was very jealous when he heard that one 'seriously injured' cadet was to be airlifted by helicopter back to base, but, being an exercise, this was an imaginary helicopter and, in reality, a people carrier. All the casualties were taken back to the main airport for interviews to record who we were, what our recollections of the accident were and what 'injuries' we had. The evening ended with squash, biscuits and crisps and a feedback session for the police who ran the exercise.

Thank you to Gloucester Airport for asking us again to take part in a fun evening and making a very generous donation to our Outside Space funds.
